Bread can cause malnutrition and painful deformities if consumed too much also, it pollutes waterways, and attract rodents and other pests.


DO NOT feed ducks bread, chips, crackers, donuts, cereal, popcorn and other similar bread-type products and scraps.

DO: Feed ducks cracked corn, oats, rice, birdseed, frozen peas, chopped lettuce, or sliced grapes. These foods are similar to natural foods ducks will forage for on their own.

Words from our President!

After a long hot Texas summer, I know that we are all looking forward to cooler weather this Fall. Our Social Committee has coordinated with neighbors in our sister HOA, The Homestead, to provide us the opportunity to get involved in various social activities, as noted elsewhere in this newsletter. I can think of no better way to meet our community neighbors than participating in those activities that interest you and your family. Suggestions for other activities are always welcomed by our Board Social Committee headed by Carmen Simpson and assisted by Kristin Bonenberger.

We have all seen costs rising everywhere. HOA costs are no exception. We have seen increases in utilities and all contractor costs, both within the HOA and the Greenbelt. I would like to thank the many homeowners that help us keep costs down by volunteering their time, efforts, and facilities. Jan and Jim Rogerson have developed our Estates website with much more flexibility than we had before, and included wonderful pictures too. This has saved us S75/month on website services through our Property Management company. A community website is a mandatory TX State requirement as well as having a valid email address on file for each homeowner.

To be more effective and to save costs, the Board has decided to communicate with our homeowners primarily via email, except for official notices. Please make sure we have your updated and correct email addresses to ensure that you receive our communications. Homeowners have offered storage space for holiday decorations saving us \$700-\$1000/year. Happy volunteers have helped put up and take down decorations, saving us at least a further \$600-\$1000.

Board members and homeowner volunteers have performed such jobs as turning off sprinkler systems after a rain, changing community light bulbs, learning to do emergency gate functions and make gate adjustments, often saving service calls of over \$350/visit, picking up trash along our sidewalks and common areas, and participating in Greenbelt clean-ups.

These are just some of the activities, big and small, which have allowed us to keep within our budget this year. We are also putting a modest amount aside each month into our Reserve account to be able to fund future major community maintenance or replacements. We have no other surpluses in our Budget, which is stretched very thin at the moment.

Your help in even little things like reporting a broken sprinkler head or running water could provide the HOA, or your neighbor, considerable savings on the next water bill.
